Teacher Subject Specialism Training - 2018/19

Message from the DfE

We would like to draw your attention to the Teacher Subject Specialism Training (TSST) grant application round, for schools to apply for funding to deliver programmes during academic year 2018/19. The application guidance and application forms are [here](#).



As you know, TSST provides grant funding to schools to deliver programmes to improve the subject knowledge of non-specialist teachers and returning teachers, and to boost skills to teach secondary mathematics, core maths, physics, and modern foreign languages.

The application round closes at noon on **Monday 11 June**. Outcomes will be communicated by the end of June.

We are inviting applications for grant funding as a local lead school and/or a regional lead school. The local lead school role, to design and deliver TSST programmes, remains largely unchanged from previous years. The regional lead school role has been introduced to coordinate provision and further develop TSST. We are aiming to select eight regional lead schools, one for each region.
